

Binder Control Guide

A printable system for keeping the bridge consistent, current, and shareable.

GOVERNING PRINCIPLE

One document, one controlling home.

A study may be referenced from many places, but it has one official location and one current version. Superseded work is preserved, labeled, and linked to its replacement rather than silently discarded.

Question what you have been taught without questioning the people you love. Keep what is written, what appears to follow, and what remains supposition visibly distinct.

Master tab organization

00 Binder Control

Cover; master contents; document register; priorities; open questions; control standard; print log.

01 Core Objective & Method

Objectives; bridge attitude; claim labels; source boundaries; only family - no racial rank.

02 The Twelve Bridge Pillars

Twelve sub-tabs, 02.01 through 02.12, matching the website's controlling sequence.

03 Answer Library

Published answers by pillar and Q-number; KJV notes; conclusions; consistency test; G's Commentary.

04 Perspective Studies

Jehovah's Witnesses; Eastern Orthodox; Catholic; Latter-day Saint; insider corrections.

05 Millennial Psalms

Creative song studies, disclaimers, Scripture connections, exploration notes, and source links.

06 Foundational Source Library

Transcript inventory; study notes; passage maps; cross-references; copyright review.

07 Consistency Ledger

Settled and working conclusions; suppositions; tensions; conflicts; resolutions and reasoning.

08 Contributions & Open Questions

Ask G submissions; objections; proposed answers; research needs; assignments.

09 Publication Masters

Current approved pages and PDFs; publication checklist; release notes.

10 Archive

Superseded copies; retired conclusions; prior print editions; replacement references; historical releases.

Tab 02 - pillar sub-tabs

Keep the twelve pillars together because they form one progressive bridge. File each controlling study first, followed by supporting answers and cross-references.

Document control

Every printable document should carry the following fields. The website can hold richer revision history, but the printed copy must still identify itself.

Field	Purpose
Document ID	Permanent identity: CMG-[tab]-[sequence]
Title	Reader-facing name
Controlling tab	Its one official home
Version and date	Identifies the current copy
Status	Published / Approved / Review requested / Draft / Open exploration / Superseded
Replaces	Points to a prior document when applicable

Numbering examples

CMG-02.07-001 - controlling No Rapture pillar study. CMG-03-027 - an Answer Library study. CMG-04-003 - a Perspective comparison.

Replacement rule

Mark the old copy SUPERSEDED, identify the replacement, and move it to Tab 10. The active binder contains only the current approved or published copy.

Printing standard

The website remains dark for screen reading. Print must use black text on white paper, comfortable 11-point or larger body type, no navigation or editing controls, single-column comparisons, protected headings, and additional pages rather than smaller type.

Physical binder routine

Update the master register whenever a document is added, revised, superseded, moved, or retired. Replace the active printed copy whenever its controlling version changes. Review open questions regularly and audit the full binder as the project grows.

Reader sharing checklist

1. Confirm Published or Approved status.
2. Confirm version and date.
3. Include the complete Scripture trail.
4. Preserve the conclusions-and-suppositions label.
5. Include the Consistency Test and G's Commentary when applicable.
6. Invite questions without turning the document into a confrontation.

What belongs where?

Pillar studies explain the bridge. Answers address one question. Perspectives compare inherited systems. Millennial Psalms remain creative exploration. Source notes document the foundation. The Consistency Ledger records whether all pieces stand together without contradiction.
