GOVERNING ATTITUDE

Shared ground

Jesus as God in flesh; conscious existence after death; resurrection and judgment; and a final deception before Christ's return.

Controlling distinction

Who has authority to settle the meaning of a disputed Scripture trail?

The comparison

Scripture, Tradition, and Magisterium

Catholic teaching

Scripture and Apostolic Tradition form one deposit authentically interpreted by the bishops in communion with the pope.

Call My G reading

No later authority closes a question the written witnesses reopen; teachers serve the trail rather than replace it.

Scripture trail

Mark 7:6-13; Acts 17:11; 1 Thessalonians 5:21; 2 Timothy 3:15-17

Tradition source: Catechism, Revelation and Tradition (identified for verification, not endorsement).

Origin of the soul

Catholic teaching

Every spiritual soul is created immediately by God; personal conscious life does not precede conception.

Call My G reading

The individual soul existed with God before flesh and enters this age without conscious memory of the former rebellion.

Scripture trail

Job 38:4-7; Jeremiah 1:5; Romans 8:29-30; Hebrews 12:9

Tradition source: Catechism 362-368 (identified for verification, not endorsement).

Adam and creation

Catholic teaching

Adam and Eve are the first parents; Genesis 2 supplies the personal account of humanity introduced in Genesis 1.

Call My G reading

Sixth-day humanity and later Eth-ha-Adam are distinct but equal; Adam's recorded lineage serves Christ's arrival, not human rank.

Scripture trail

Genesis 1:26-31; 2:5-25; 5:1-3; Luke 3:23-38

Tradition source: Catechism, The Fall (identified for verification, not endorsement).

Death, judgment, and purgatory

Catholic teaching

The soul survives death, receives particular judgment, and may undergo final purification before heaven.

Call My G reading

The conscious dead are separated across the gulf; the Lord's Day supplies teaching and reconciliation, without a separate purgatorial doctrine.

Scripture trail

Luke 16:19-31; 1 Peter 3:18-20; Revelation 20:1-15

Tradition source: Catechism 1021-1032 (identified for verification, not endorsement).

Resurrection

Catholic teaching

All the dead rise with their own transformed bodies reunited with their souls.

Call My G reading

The same person rises incorruptible, with Paul's spiritual body and exclusion of flesh and blood controlling the description.

Scripture trail

1 Corinthians 15:35-54; 2 Corinthians 5:1-8

Tradition source: Catechism 988-1019 (identified for verification, not endorsement).

Antichrist and return

Catholic teaching

The Church faces a final trial and religious deception before Christ's victory; a secret pre-tribulation rapture is not required.

Call My G reading

This is strong common ground; Call My G identifies the counterfeit at the Sixth Trump and Christ at the Seventh.

Scripture trail

Matthew 24:23-31; 2 Thessalonians 2:1-4; Revelation 11:15

Tradition source: Catechism 675-677 (identified for verification, not endorsement).

The Millennium

Catholic teaching

Catholic teaching rejects millenarian distortions and commonly reads Revelation 20 through Christ's reign and final consummation.

Call My G reading

The Millennium is the literal Lord's Day after the Seventh Trump, before Satan's final release and judgment.

Scripture trail

Revelation 20:1-15; 2 Peter 3:8; Ezekiel 44:23-25

Tradition source: Catechism 675-677 (identified for verification, not endorsement).

Questions for an informed insider

These are not traps. They identify the joints where the two readings can be tested.

1. How should foreknowledge, election, and the sons of God at creation be joined if each soul begins at conception?
2. What permits the Magisterium to close a reading a Scripture trail appears to reopen?
3. Does Genesis require the first two creation accounts to describe one moment?
4. Where does Scripture place purgatorial purification relative to the gulf and Revelation 20?
5. How does the final-trial teaching affect assumptions about escaping Antichrist?

Claim status and fairness

This is a working comparison, not a declaration that every member believes every point in precisely the same way. Denominational descriptions summarize official teaching. Call My G positions are conclusions or foundational synthesis unless a cited passage states the proposition explicitly.

Source boundary
